

**Camden Town Council Meeting
December 12, 2018
Camden-Jackson Twp. Library, Reading Room**

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Vice-President Mark Schock opened the regular meeting of the Camden Town Council at 7:00. Present were Member Andy Robison, Clerk Treasurer Pat Casserly, Attorney Anne Briggs and three guests. President Brent Deel was absent.

Mr. Robison provided the motions to accept the minutes from the November 14th meeting, the December Docket and the December Allowance Docket. The seconds were from Mr. Schock. Prior to the start of the meeting the Council was given the opportunity to review the claims and ask any questions. Council members were given copies of the monthly reports and signed the acknowledgement.

The street bids for work associated with the Community Crossing Grant from INDOT were opened and read aloud. Central Paving, Inc. and E & B Paving submitted bids.

Old Business:

There was no update on the installation of cameras at the Camden Mart.

Public Comments:

Kandance Funk at 221 W. Main expressed concern about cars parking at her drive and she has difficulty seeing when backing out. Following discussion, the Members felt the best solution was to paint the yellow "No Parking" paint further east and west on the curb by the property.

Council Comments:

Mr. Robison stated the Cornerstone Cafe will open at 1:30 on Saturday for a special vendor event. The public is welcome.

The Baptist Church Living Nativity was well received with approximately 100 people attending.

The Christmas Bazaar was a success and vendors are planning for next year.
